

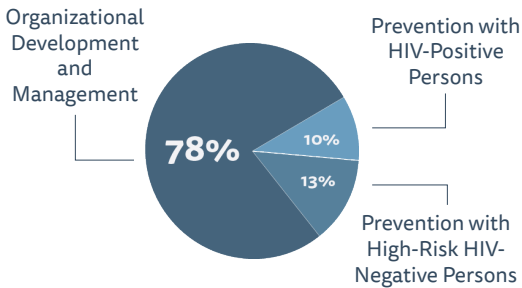


YEAR THREE IN REVIEW

During the PS14-1403 April 1, 2016 – March 31, 2017 reporting period, CBA@JSI staff focused efforts on supporting the evolving capacity building assistance (CBA) needs of community-based organizations (CBOs) to deliver High-Impact HIV Prevention (HIP) services in alignment with our funded Category B components, **Prevention with HIV-Positive Persons, Prevention with High-Risk HIV-Negative Persons, and Organizational Development and Management.**

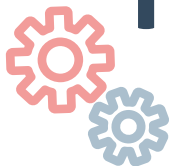

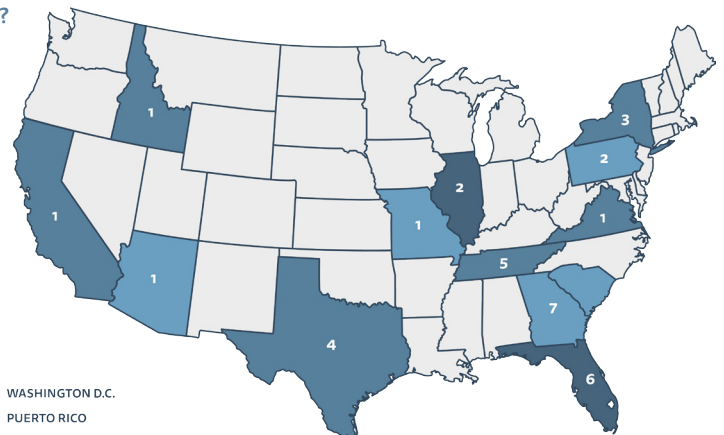
